Dear Parents and dancers,

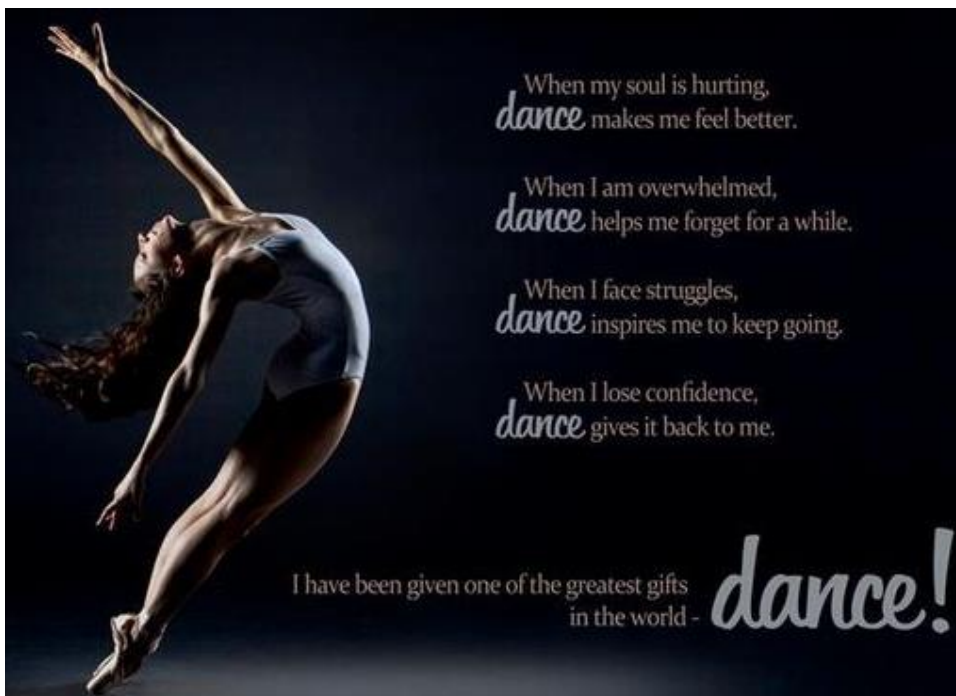

Attendance Policy

Choreography is based on formation, teamwork, and cannot be taught with an incomplete class. Unlike other sports where someone can just fill in for you, the entire class is impacted when one student does not attend. This is why attendance is crucial to the success of our program.

We expect that company dancers and their parents will take initiative when missing a class:

1. Communicate with Erica or Karie
2. Attend a make-up class
3. Make sure you know any choreography that you missed by meeting with a teammate or scheduling a private lesson with an instructor

Infractions of the attendance policy reflect poorly on a dancer's commitment to their team and will be taken into consideration in team selection for next year. We believe that school comes first but we ask you to manage your schedule so that homework is done during school and before class.

SICKNESS/ABSENSES:

- If a child is sick, Erica or Karie needs notification prior to class time. A doctor's note will be required for sickness or injuries lasting over one week.
- If a child misses class due to being sick, they will be responsible for meeting with someone in their class OR a teacher (\$35 per half hour) to learn the missed choreography. Contact Erica to arrange private catch-up lessons with instructors. IF a student does not learn the choreography they missed, they will be removed from that section of the dance and possibly more.
- If they miss a non-choreography class (Ballet or Technique) they must attend an extra technical make-up class that week. Contact Erica for make-up class options.

INJURIES:

- If your child is injured, they are expected to still attend ALL CLASSES to observe. This applies to both technique classes AND choreography classes
- As long as a child intends to perform at ANY competition or recital, they are expected to attend all classes AND performances to support their team.

PERSONAL ABSENCES:

- If you miss more than 3 classes per genre for personal reasons, you will be removed from a dance or performance.
- If you miss class for personal reasons, you must notify Erica or Karie in advance of class!
- For non-choreography classes, you can make them up by attending another technical class and your absence will be cleared.
- The week prior to performances is MANDATORY! If you are not in class that week you will be removed from the dance.

Program Information

Competition fees are applied the month of the event.

Competition Fee Breakdown

- Group is \$50-\$60 per dancer
- Solo is \$130-\$150
- Duet is \$80-\$100 per dancer
- Costumes fees are applied in October and are \$100-\$125 for competitive dances.

Being on a team year after year is NOT guaranteed. Each year, TDA faculty evaluates intensive dancers for the next year's placement based on three major categories:

ATTITUDE

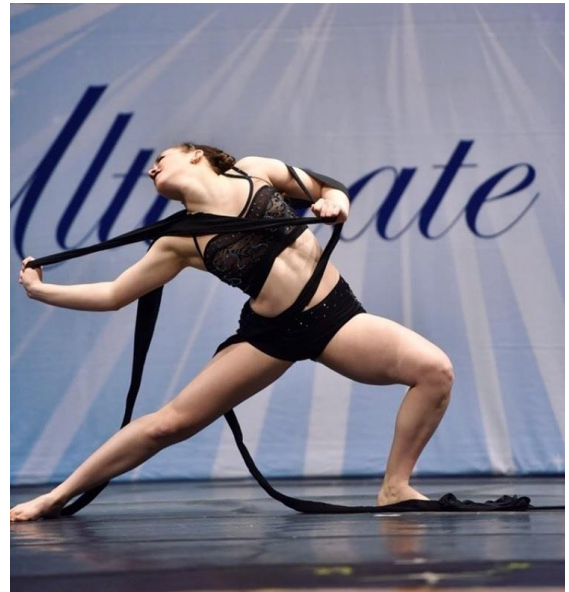
- A desire to learn
- Responsiveness to constructive feedback
- Kindness and compassion towards other dancers
- Respect towards teachers

SKILL

- Technical abilities comparable to other dancers in the category region-wide
- Endurance, flexibility, and strength improving year-after-year
- Ability to dance onstage with other dancers – spatial awareness, formations, stage presence

COMMITMENT

- Preparedness for classes and competitions – knowing your choreography, taking initiative to always do the right thing, always having the proper dance attire, costumes, accessories
- Ability to follow through with all mandatory commitments
- Excellent attendance at all classes and proper communication when conflicts arise
- Understanding you are part of a TEAM and your behavior/attendance/preparedness reflects on the entire team



Code of Conduct

Behavior In & Out of the Classroom:

Sportsmanship

Good sportsmanship is expected of all company members as leaders and role models at The Dance Academy. Dancers are expected to treat everyone with respect in and out of the studio. Negative behavior toward an instructor or fellow classmate will be grounds for suspension from performances, class, or expulsion from the program. **Positive, inclusive, hard-working attitudes WILL be factored in to each dancer's consideration for next year's company placement.**

Any company-related events such as dinners, sleepovers, team gatherings must include ALL teammates. Exclusivity is NOT tolerated.

***NO CELL PHONES OR FOOD* allowed in class**

If granted permission by the instructor, dancers may use their phones to record dances for practicing or sharing purposes.

Taking Initiative

Intensive students are expected to arrive early, ready to work hard. Please email if student is going to be more than 10 minutes late.

Dancers are expected to clean up after themselves in the studio, waiting area, study room, and bathroom. If they are eating meals at the studio, trash must be disposed of OUTSIDE the studio. Each dancer is in-charge of their belongings. Lost or forgotten items may be found in the Lost and Found in the waiting room next to Studio 3. All unclaimed items are donated every 3 months.

Communication:

Honest and candid communication between parents, Erica, and students is critical to the success of each dancer. Parent conferences can be scheduled at any time. If concerns or pressing issues arise please contact **Erica: 617-614-5468** or Erica@siagel.com. **If you contact Erica during CLOSED studio hours, she will respond the following business day.** Please refrain from contacting Erica on her cell phone unless for absolute emergencies.

Outside Training:

We encourage all of our students to learn from as many choreographers as possible. Please note that classes taken outside of TDA must be approved by Erica and MAY NOT conflict with your classes at TDA. This includes school dance teams, other dance studio classes and intensives.
